The Army Logistics University (ALU) Library is pleased to present the release of its summer 2010 newsletter. It also serves as a reminder that we are able to support our customers with a wide range of reference services including access to many valuable databases and resources in a variety of media formats.

The ALU Library is centrally located on the 2nd and 3rd floors of the new academic building and consists of two main components. A state-of-the-art research and information center that will include the consolidated resources of the Army Logistics Management College, Transportation Center, and the Ordnance Center libraries scheduled for completion in FY2011.

The second component is the Fort Lee Community Library. This library is available to ALU students, staff, and the Fort Lee community and offers a current collection of fiction, nonfiction, children's books, audio-visual material, and periodicals. Fort Lee Community Library patrons have access to six internet computers and a copy machine.

The ALU and Fort Lee community regular Library hours are Monday-Friday, 0800-1900; Saturday, 1000-1700; and Sunday, 1200-1700.


ALU Language and Cultural Learning Center

Desert Storm Logistics Collection

The Army Logistics University (ALU) Library has officially received an extensive collection of documents detailing the logistical support during Operation Desert Storm. In a May 17th ceremony on the 3rd floor of the library with Fort Lee Commander, MG James E. Chambers presiding, retired LTG William "Gus" Pagonis officially donated his unique collection of Persian Gulf War material to ALU. This collection represents the initial installment of the Senior Sustainment Collection and is one of the most comprehensive collections of logistical documentation ever donated to an Army professional development school.

The collection is approximately 1100 linear feet in size and consists of hundreds of videotapes, interviews, briefing papers, after action reports, operational orders, historical documents, photographs, maps, articles, and monographs. This historic accumulation of material was collected by LTG Pagonis during his tenure as commander of the 22nd Support Command and chief logistician for Gen. H. Norman Schwarzkopf Jr. during Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm.

Reference Librarian, John Shields, accepted the donation on behalf of the ALU library where it will be archived and made available for official and research use at the university. Various news media were in attendance and WTVR (CBS channel 6) included a video segment of the event on the local news.





This SirsiDynix online system enables universal access to the library's catalog via the Internet by providing a unique e-Library solution designed to satisfy your various research needs with access to the rich abundance of electronic information available from our library holdings, the Web, and many other library e-services -

All from a single, simple search screen!

As a registered library customer you now have the ability to review your account, renew your checked-out items, change your Pin number, and contact the library staff, all online. Upon registration, you will be given a four digit Pin number to be used along with your Alternate Identification to access your account online. Included in our collection of databases and electronic resources available at your desktop are the following:

[ProQuest ABI/INFORM Global](#) (Including same day availability for the *Wall Street Journal* and *Barron's* and many others.)

ABI/INFORM Global is the oldest and most comprehensive source of business and management information. It is an important tool for users researching worldwide business conditions and trends, management techniques, corporate strategies, and industry-specific topics including business functions and IT applications. Other areas of interest include accounting, finance, marketing, management, international business, etc. ABI/INFORM Global generally provides abstracting and indexing from 1971 forward.

ABI/Inform Global features over 1,570 journal titles with citations and abstracts including prestigious publication such as the *Wall Street Journal* and *Barron's* (current day availability). It includes over 800 titles in full text with facsimile page images. The service also includes 350 English-language titles from outside the U.S.

[EBSCO Military & Government Collection](#)

Designed to offer current news pertaining to all branches of the military, this database offers a thorough collection of periodicals, academic journals and many other information sources. The *Military & Government Collection* provides cover-to-cover full text for nearly 300 journals and periodicals. The database also includes full text for 245 pamphlets and offers indexing and abstracts for nearly 400 titles. Some publications covered in this database include, *Air Force Comptroller*, *Army Reserve Magazine*, *Defense Studies*, *Global Security Review*, *Joint Force Quarterly*, *Military Technology*, *National Review*, *Defense*, *Combat Edge*, *FBI Law Enforcement Bulletin*, *Foreign Affairs*, *Military Technology*, *Naval Forces*, and many more. Many full text titles are available in searchable PDF, or scanned-in-color.
