

Have You Submitted Your DA Form 12-5?

Readers of *Army Logistician* magazine, take note! Your supply of magazines is obtained through the Army's pinpoint distribution system from the USA AG Publications Center, 2800 Eastern Boulevard, Baltimore, Maryland 21220. They have to be requisitioned and chances are about even that your unit has not yet prepared and submitted the new order form, DA Form 12-5. If you want to continue getting *Army Logistician*, remind your publications officer or NCO that the new DA Form 12-5 is required. Instructions are printed on the reverse side of the form.
